## PROPOSED, REVISED BOARD POLICY POLICY NO. 20-0023-000 ENERGY AND RESOURCE CONSERVATION

## **OCTOBER 23, 2023**

## **Background Information:**

The Board maintains a manual which sets forth the various policies of the Harford County Public Schools. The manual contains policies which are either required by federal and state law and regulation or which are, in the Board's judgment, necessary and appropriate for the school system to operate in a lawful, appropriate and effective manner. Included among the Board's manual is a policy entitled, 20-0023-000 Energy and Resource Conservation.

## **Discussion:**

House Bill 630 (HB630), an act concerning **Primary and Secondary Education** – **School District Energy Use** – was passed for the purpose of requiring each school district to adopt or update the school district's energy policy. HB630 specified the contents that must be included in each school district's energy policy. As necessary to comply with HB630, the Assistant Superintendent for Operations, the Executive Director of Facilities Management, and the Energy Resource Conservation Manager for Harford County Public Schools have reviewed the subject policy and through the Superintendent propose to add the following language to the existing Harford County Public Schools Board policy 20-0023-000 entitled Energy and Resource Conservation:

- 1. Explore and utilize creative procurement strategies to secure services required to implement planned energy conservation programs.
- 2. Utilize technology to monitor and develop energy usage reports concerning but not limited to:
  - a. The amount of electricity used from renewable energy sources; and
  - b. The overall electricity use by source and square foot; and
  - c. Current and historical data of energy used by square foot.

This policy was recommended by the Superintendent to the Board at the September 11, 2023, Board business meeting. This policy was posted for public comment for thirty (30) days. One (1) comment was received and forwarded to the Board for review.

## (House Bill 630)

## AN ACT concerning

# Primary and Secondary Education – School District Energy Use – Policy and Study

FOR the purpose of requiring each school district to adopt or update a school district energy policy beginning on a certain date; specifying the contents of a school district energy policy; encouraging school districts to set certain targets in their school district energy policy; requiring that a school district energy policy be posted on the school district's website and updated with a certain frequency; requiring the Interagency Commission on School Construction to coordinate with the Department of the Environment and the Maryland Energy Administration to develop a certain template on or before a certain date; requiring the Interagency Commission to coordinate with the Administration and the Maryland Clean Energy Center to study and make recommendations regarding the Maryland Net Zero Energy School Initiative Grant Program; requiring the Interagency Commission to report its findings to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to school district energy policies.

BY adding to

Article – Education Section 5–312.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### **Article - Education**

5-312.1.

- (A) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2022, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL ADOPT OR UPDATE A SCHOOL DISTRICT ENERGY POLICY.
  - (B) A SCHOOL DISTRICT ENERGY POLICY MUST:
- (1) ADDRESS THE PURCHASING, CONSERVATION, AND EFFICIENCY OF ENERGY FOR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT;
  - (2) PROVIDE FOR THE MONITORING AND REPORTING OF:

- (I) THE AMOUNT OF ELECTRICITY USED FROM RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCES;
- (II) THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S ANNUAL ELECTRICITY USE THAT IS FROM RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCES; AND
- (III) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S OVERALL ELECTRICITY USE BY SOURCE AND SQUARE FOOT; AND
- (3) INCLUDE CURRENT AND HISTORICAL DATA ON THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S ENERGY USE BY SQUARE FOOT.
- (C) IN ADOPTING OR UPDATING A SCHOOL DISTRICT ENERGY POLICY, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT IS ENCOURAGED TO SET TARGETS TO INCREASE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S USE OF RENEWABLE ENERGY AND REDUCE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS.
  - (D) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ENERGY POLICY SHALL BE:
    - (1) POSTED ON THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S WEBSITE; AND
    - (2) UPDATED EVERY  $\frac{2}{3}$  YEARS.
- (E) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2022, THE INTERAGENCY COMMISSION SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT AND THE MARYLAND ENERGY ADMINISTRATION TO DEVELOP A STANDARDIZED REPORTING TEMPLATE THAT SCHOOL DISTRICTS CAN USE TO REPORT ON:
- (1) THE AMOUNT OF ELECTRICITY FROM RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCES THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT USED;
- (2) THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S ANNUAL ELECTRICITY USE THAT IS FROM RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCES; AND
  - (3) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S OVERALL ELECTRICITY USE BY:
    - (I) SOURCE;
    - (II) SQUARE FOOT; AND
    - (III) INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL, IF POSSIBLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- (a) The Interagency Commission on School Construction shall coordinate with the Maryland Energy Administration and the Maryland Clean Energy Center to study and make recommendations on how to:
- (1) expand the Maryland Net Zero Energy School Initiative Grant Program; and
- (2) provide additional funding for the Maryland Net Zero Energy School Initiative Grant Program.
- (b) On or before December 1, 2021, the Interagency Commission on School Construction shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  $1,\,2021.$
