BACKGROUND

- The Office of Fine Arts offers all students the opportunity to participate in robust academic Art, Dance, Drama, and Music experiences that support and deeply enrich the education of the whole child throughout their career of educational experiences in Harford County Public Schools.
- Our Middle Schools currently support and continually produce evidence of superior performances and assessments in band, chorus, and orchestra curricular experiences. In support of the Middle School Innovation Plan, which is aligned to the Blueprint for Maryland's Future, the Office of Fine Arts offered to all middle school students an experience in Drama. This 10-week Beginning Drama Course for grades 6-8 will also support student choice, engagement, and overall success in student learning and preparation for High School.
- This proposed action will build a bridge for middle school students moving to high school that will enhance and support the learner attributes of the North Star Student and Blueprint post CCR pathways.



Background Summary

All students in our 9 middle schools have the opportunity to participate in robust academic Art and Music experiences.

Middle School Principals were surveyed and suggested adding Beginning Drama as a Unified Arts course offering.

If approved, this course will add student choice and for many, will encourage them to stay in school because the arts give them voice and a stronger sense of belonging.

Studies have shown that Fine Art Students often perform at a high level on state testing in English/Language Arts Literacy, Math, and Science.

This proposed action will also build a bridge that enhances and supports the learner attributes of the North Star Student and BluePrint post CCR pathways.
