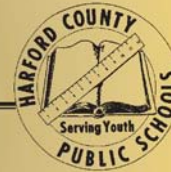

- Recognized the following:

- Approved the following appointments to the [Board Ethics Panel](#):
 - Mr. Thomas E. Hammen to serve the balance of Dr. Edward R. Sieracki's term, ending February 26, 2011 (the opening was created as a result of Dr. Sieracki's resignation)
 - Mr. David L. Brond to serve a second five-year term ending May, 2015
- Approved promotions and appointments for the 2010-11 school year:
 - Dr. Jonathan Brown appointed to the Director of Community Engagement, Equity, and Cultural Proficiency
- Approved the Consent Agenda, which included the ratification of Negotiated Agreements with the [American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees \(AFSCME\)](#) and the Association of [Harford County Administrative, Technical and Supervisory Professionals \(AHCATSP\)](#)
- Approved the proposed revised Policy No. 24-0006-000 entitled [Bullying, Harassment or Intimidation of Students](#). Board Legal Counsel Patrick Spicer will investigate the ability to add clarifying language to the statutory definition of "electronic devices."
- Participated in a discussion regarding the [FY2012 Capital Improvement Budget](#), which was presented at the June 26th meeting.
- Received the Superintendent's Report which included:
 - Expressed a warm welcome to the new Student Representative to the Board Caitlin Dooling.
 - On June 30th, a Joppatowne family received their new LEED certified home courtesy of Harford Technical High School through Habitat for Humanity sponsored by Bank of America.
 - Congratulated the Skills USA Students from Harford Technical High School competed nationally and won 20 medals.
