meeting held Tuesday, January 20. The school was originally approved to be named Campus Hills Elementary School by the Board on Monday, December 8, 2008. The motion to rename the building was brought forth by Board member Robin Rich, who suggested the facility be named after the late Dr. Jacqueline C. Haas, HCPS superintendent of schools from 1999 - 2008. Board policy suggests that the name of a public school facility should "give proper recognition to the community which it serves," but also provides for a building/ground to be named for a person, living or dead, who has made "significant contributions to education in the Harford County Public Schools." The policy further requires the intent to name be widely publicized in the community with an invitation for the public to submit names in writing or in person during Board meetings in the 60-day interim between announcing the intent to name and action being taken. The Superintendent will provide the Board with a complete list of names suggested along with her recommendation at the Monday, March 9th Board meeting. Allowing for 60-days required prior to naming the building, the Board will take action at its March 23, 2009 business meeting (6:30 p.m.), HCPS/A.A. Roberty Building). It is an opportunity for drama students and teachers from the northeast region of Maryland to come together and participate in a variety of activities that will showcase their love and passion for the performing arts. The snow dates will be the following weekend, February 27th and 28th. Students will have the opportunity to take part in a variety of workshops that will help them enhance their performing and/or technical skills such as acting skills, costuming, vocal techniques, lighting design, scenic construction, improvisation, auditioning techniques, dance, etc. For students who wish to showcase their talents, the Festival will offer competitions in (7) event categories: dance, improvisation, monologues, playwriting, scenes, technical portfolio, and vocal.
