POLICY/PROCEDURE MANUAL SUMMARY CATEGORY:			

I. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to set forth the position and criteria of the Board regarding student access to telehealth appointments.

II. Definitions

For the purpose of this policy, the following definitions apply:

- A. Telehealth Appointment – A mode of delivering healthcare services through the use of telecommunications technologies by a health care practitioner to a patient at a different physical location than that of the health care practitioner.

II. Statement of Policy

- A. The Board is committed to ensuring the school system is in compliance with House Bill (HB) 522 – Public Schools – Telehealth Appointments – State Guidelines, Policies, and Access (Md. Code, Education 4-143)
- B. Middle and High School students will have access to telehealth appointments during the school day as long as all criteria has been met.
- C. Criteria for the allowance of telehealth appointments are outlined in the accompanying procedure to this policy.
- D. Reference to this policy and its accompanying procedure will be made in the student/parent handbook.
- E. School personnel, parents, guardians, and students will be made aware of this policy and its accompanying procedure.
