Goals

Ensure every student graduates able to **DEMONSTRATE** readiness for college, career, and life.

Students to earn college credits and industry recognized credentials while in HS.

Key Components

Academic opportunities
(AP, IB, CTE, Dual Enrollment, etc.).

Real-world experiences
(Apprenticeship, TSA, ASVAB, MD Seal, Industry Recognized Credentials, etc.)

North Star Graduate Outcomes

OUTCOME ONE

Earned Potential College Credit via AP; IB; CTE

- **Advanced Placement (AP):** Achieving a score of 3 or higher on one or more AP assessment.
- **International Baccalaureate (IB):** Achieving a score of 4 or higher on IB exam or A, B, C on Extended Essay or Theory of Knowledge.
- **Career and Technology Education (CTE):** Achieving a GPA of 3.0 or higher in each course of a Maryland State Department of Education approved CTE program of study.



OUTCOME TWO

Earned College Credit via Dual Enrollment

Successfully passes one or more dual enrollment course with a course grade of D or higher earns college credit at Harford Community College.




OUTCOME THREE

Earned an Industry-Recognized Career (IRC) Credential via Licensure, Apprenticeship, TSA

Earned a career licensure, completed an apprenticeship program, Earned certification (such as the ASVAB, Maryland Seal of Biliteracy, or through the Workforce Investment Program, etc.), or met the Technical Skills Assessment (TSA) requirements in a CTE program.

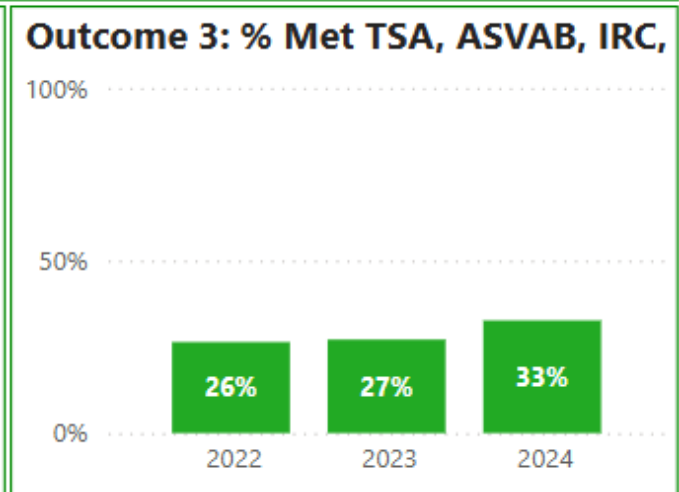

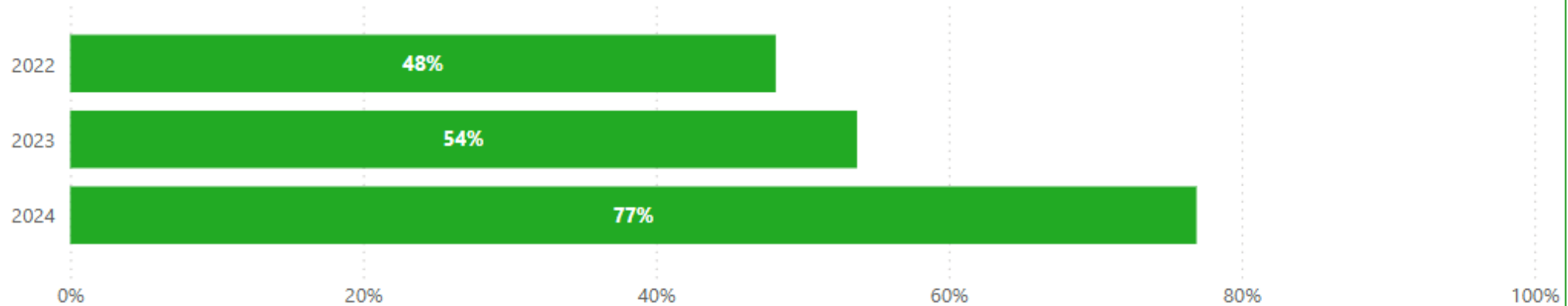

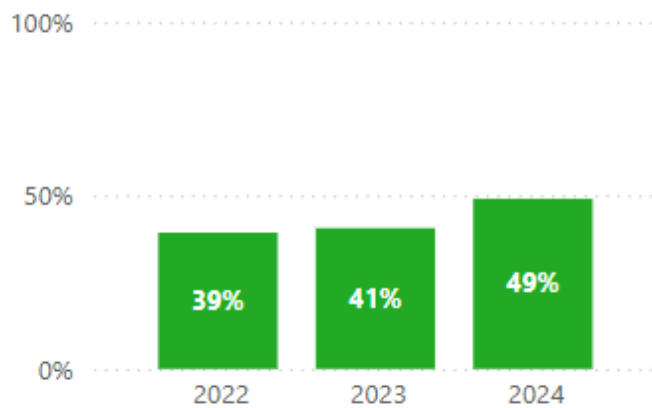

Percentage of Students Meeting Any NS Graduate Outcome by Graduation Year (2022, 2023, 2024)

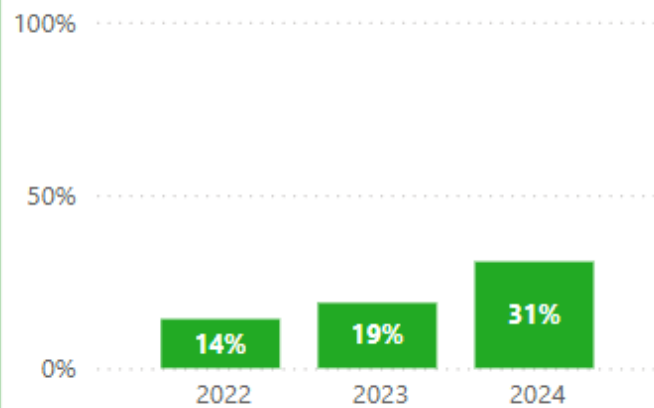


Outcome 1: % Met AP/IB/CTE



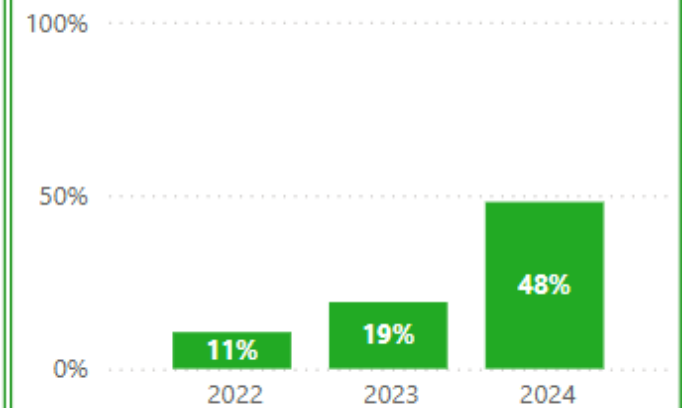

Outcome 2: % Met Dual Enrollment



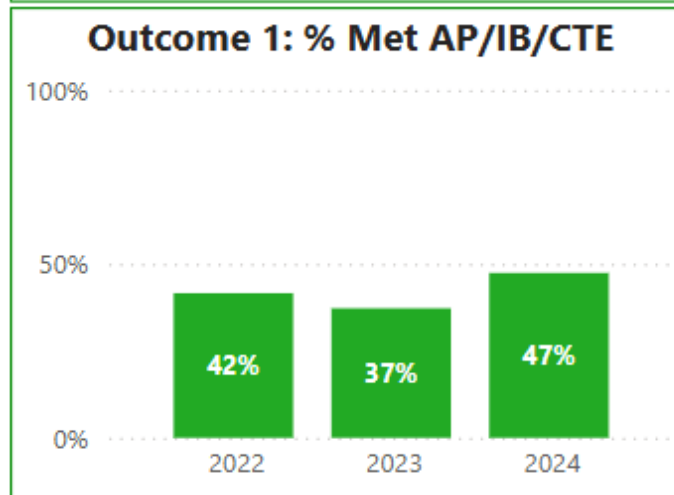
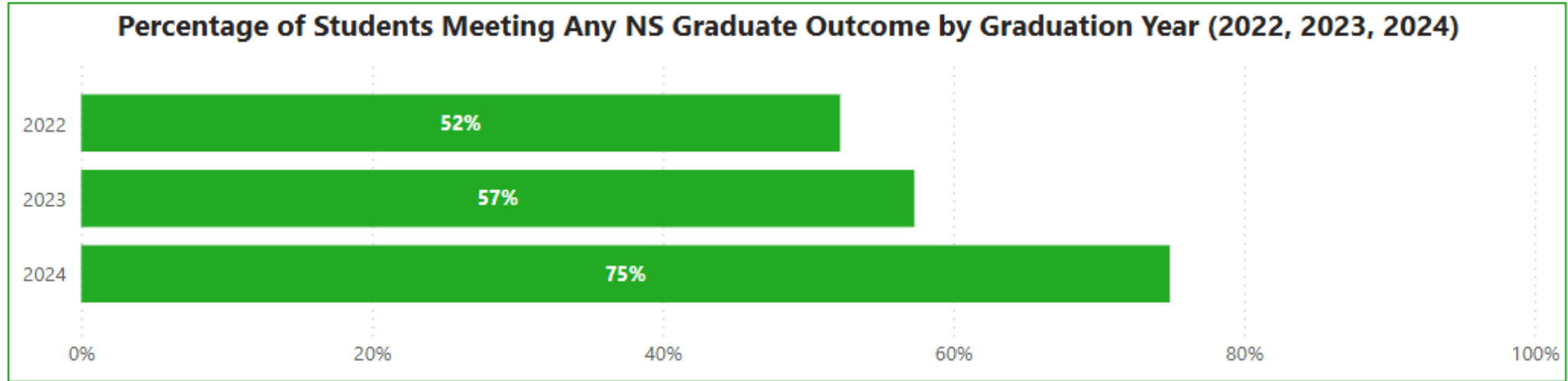

Data Analytics Dashboards:

- **Leading Data:** Tracks current student progress toward outcomes.
- **Lagging Data:** Analyzes outcomes for graduated students to inform improvements.

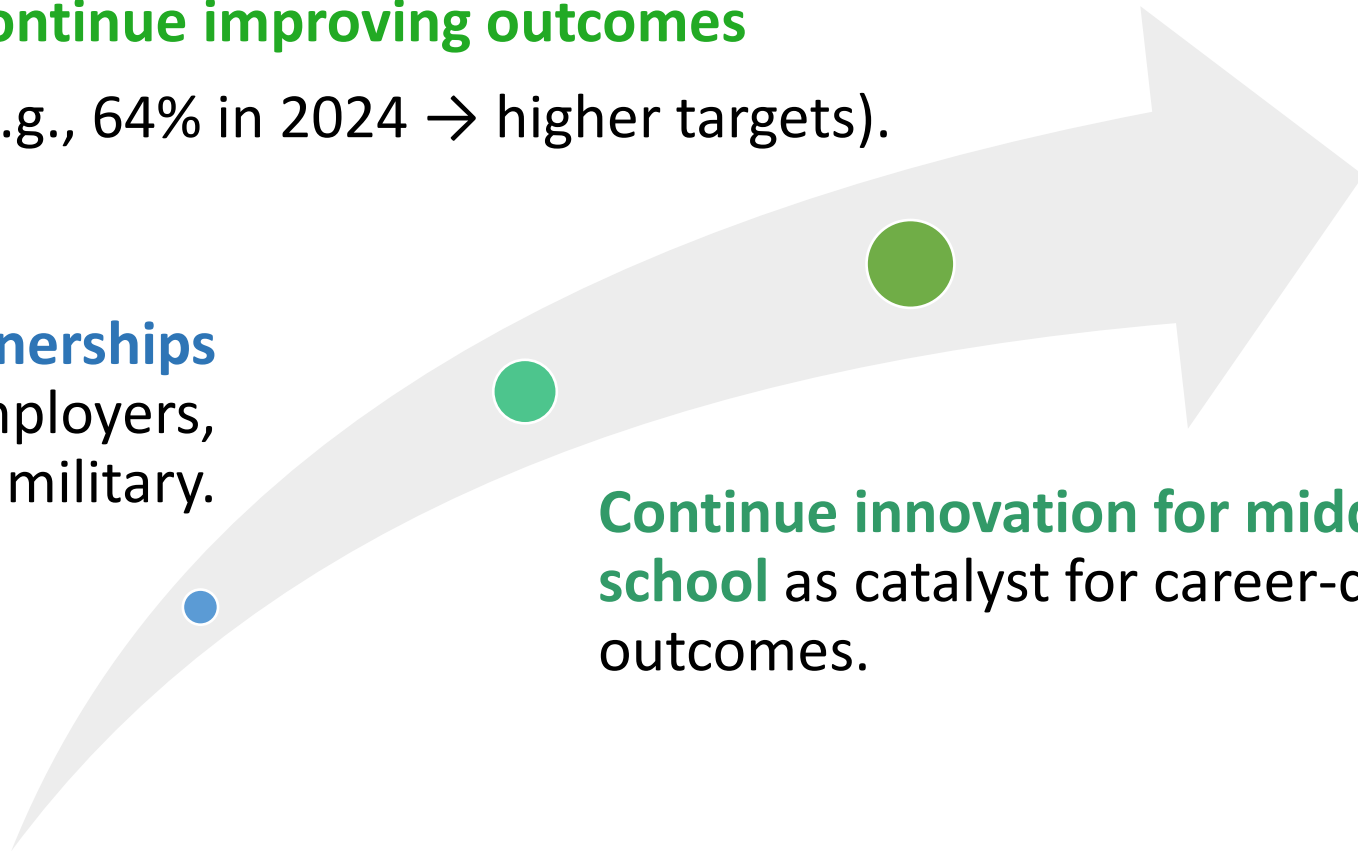
