The Cinderella Project



The Project was started in 2014 from a simple conversation that Miss Webster had in the hall with a female a student. She asked the young lady if she was going to the prom, and she said that she would love to, but her family could not afford it. From that point, the wheels started turning and a mission to raise the funds began.

The first year we were able to provide ten prom tickets. At this point, we have granted almost two hundred prom tickets.

Each year we also host the Cinderella Project event. We invite the community to join us for dinner as we showcase the talents of the First Ladies and the work they have done all year. We award the "Girl of the Year Award", senior leis for 4-year members, and the "Gracious Lady" award. About 150 to 200 people attend this event each year.
