## Graduation Requirements

Requirements for graduation from a Maryland Public High School are listed below. Students must earn a minimum of 26 credits in Grades 9 through 12 to receive a Maryland High School Diploma from Harford County Public Schools.

English	4 Credits
Mathematics	4 credits, including Algebra and Geometry. <b>Must be enrolled in a mathematics course in each year of high school</b> ( <i>maximum of 4 years of attendance, unless in the 5th or 6th year a mathematics course is needed to meet a graduation requirement</i> )
Science	3 Credits including Biology
Social Studies	3 Credits including American Government, World History, and US History
Fine Art	1 Credit
Phys Ed	1 Credit including Foundations of Fitness and Physical Activity
Health	1 Credit
Technology	1 Credit of Foundations of Technology or AP Computer Science Principles
Career Pathway and Completer Program Requirements	4-6 Credits 4 credits in an approved Career & Technology Education (CTE) Career Completer Program Or 2 World Language (Requirement for 4 year College/University)
Electives	May vary
