HCRASC Equitable Affairs Committee Hosts Holiday Food Drive to Support Access to Food in Harford County

Abingdon, MD — The Harford County Regional Association of Student Councils (HCRASC) Equitable Affairs Committee (EAC) successfully hosted a holiday food drive on Tuesday, December 17, 2025, from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Ward Y. Families visited the Y and received pre-assembled bags of food. The initiative aimed to address food insecurity during the holiday season and support families across the greater Harford County area.

The drive was led by HCRASC EAC Chair **Kareem Wallace**, with support from HCRASC EAC Co-Chair **Pearl Lin**, HCRASC Chief of Staff **Viraj Singh**, HCRASC EAC members, and community volunteers. The food pick-up drive brought together several community partners to ensure both effective collection and distribution of non-perishable food items.



The HCRASC Equitable Affairs Committee collaborated with the Harford Community Action Agency (HCAA), which was represented by HCAA Chief of Staff & Grants Oversight and former HCRASC President **Adam Hiob**. HCAA assisted by supplying HCRASC with over 50 string bags, each full of non-perishable food items.

The Ward Y also played a major role in the success of the event, as they supplied food and provided a venue for the event. With coordination support from **Megan Chenworth**, volunteers helped organize, bag, and distribute food to families in need during the pick-up drive. This collaboration allowed for direct community engagement and immediate impact.

Additionally, HCRASC continued its partnership with the Sexual Assault/Spouse Abuse Resource Center (SARC) for the second consecutive year. With assistance from **Erin Flynn**, SARC facilitated the distribution of remaining food items to individuals and families who were unable to attend the event, ensuring that all donated goods were utilized effectively.
