Welcome to Stars of Summer! Stars of Summer is an online learning program designed for HCPS students who were enrolled in kindergarten through eighth grade during the 2022 - 2023 academic year. This program provides students the opportunity to experience camp-like workshops in all content areas. Each camp is designed to be fun, engaging, and interactive! Live instruction is provided by HCPS teachers.

Stars of Summer will run in separate, one-week blocks between July 18 and August 4, Monday through Thursday.
