# SUMMER<sup>2022</sup> PROGRAMS

Harford County Public Schools (HCPS) is offering a variety of summer learning programs for students in grades PreK through 12. Details for summer programs can be found below. Registration for all summer programs will begin on Monday, May 16, 2022, at 7:00 a.m. and will close on Saturday, May 28, 2022 at 12:00 p.m.

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## ACADEMIC TUTORING (VIRTUAL)

*Academic Tutoring* is intended to support students with a review of the pre-requisite skills and knowledge necessary as they enter their next grade level or sequential course for students in Kindergarten through Grade 12. The personalized tutoring schedules will be determined based on the student's academic needs and will be provided twice per week in a virtual one-on-one or small group setting. Academic Tutors are HCPS staff members and use HCPS curriculum to support student learning.

## ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL (IN-PERSON)

The *Elementary School Summer Learning Program* provides current elementary school students in grades Pre-K-5 the opportunity to receive expanded access to reading/writing and mathematics curricula aligned to the Maryland College Career Readiness Standards. Location sites include:

- Forest Lakes Elementary School
- Emmorton Elementary School
- Roye-Williams Elementary School
- Magnolia Elementary School
- George D. Lisby Elementary School

Classes will begin Monday, July 11 and end Thursday, July 28, 2022, and will be held 4-days per week, Monday through Thursday, from 8:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. **All HCPS buildings will be closed on Tuesday, July 19, 2022, for Election Day.** If transportation is available, it will only be provided to eligible students who choose the assigned summer school site serving their current school (see chart in Elementary Summer School Description). Families will be notified prior to the program starting if transportation will be available.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL (IN-PERSON)

The *Middle School Summer Learning Program* provides middle school students in grades 6-8 the opportunity to receive expanded access to reading/writing and mathematics curricula aligned to the Maryland College Career Readiness Standards. Students who did not pass their reading and/or mathematics classes during the 2021-22 school year are encouraged to register for the four-week summer program. Location sites include:

- Edgewood Middle School
- North Harford Middle School
- Havre de Grace Middle School

Classes will begin Monday, July 11 and end Thursday, August 4, 2022, and will be held 4-days per week, Monday through Thursday, from 7:45 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. **All HCPS buildings will be closed on Tuesday, July 19, 2022, for Election Day.** If transportation is available, it will only be provided to eligible students who choose the assigned summer school site serving their current school (see chart in Elementary Summer School Description). Families will be notified prior to the program starting if transportation will be available.

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#### HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL (IN-PERSON)

The *High School Summer Learning Program* provides high school students in grades 9-12 the opportunity to complete a four-week credit recovery program. Students are expected to participate in daily in-person sessions and independently work on course content throughout until all required course content is complete. Classes begin Monday, July 11 and end Thursday, August 4, 2022, and will be held 4-days per week, Monday through Thursday, from 7:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. **All HCPS buildings will be closed on Tuesday, July 19, 2022, for Election Day.**

Physical Education (PE) courses and Geometry will be offered for credit recovery and original credit. Original Credit Geometry will be held 4-days per week, Monday through Thursday, from 7:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Wellness Walking will be the only course offered in a virtual format this year.

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#### STARS OF SUMMER (VIRTUAL)

*Stars of Summer* is a virtual learning program providing students the chance to experience camp-like workshops in all content areas. Each four-day workshop is designed to be engaging and interactive! Stars of Summer is led by HCPS teachers and is available for students who are entering grades 1-9 for the 2022-23 school year.
