WHAT IS A HEART SCREENING?

Sudden cardiac arrest takes the lives of thousands of children every year. It is the #1 cause of death for student athletes. It kills more adults than lung cancer, breast cancer, and AIDS, combined. But, that's it. It is not enough.

PATRIOTS

- 1 Complete short medical history and consent form.
- Evaluate blood pressure, height and weight.
- 3 Listen to heart; and receive electrocardiogram.
- Some students will receive an echocardiogram, if needed.

WHAT IS SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST?

The heart stops beating, suddenly and unexpectedly. Blood stops circulating through the body and a person collapses.

WHAT ARE THE WARNING SIGNS?

Sometimes warning signs happen and sometimes they don't.

Watch out for:

- Fainting or seizures during exercise
- Unexplained shortness of breath
- Rapid heart rate
- · Extreme dizziness or fatigue
- Unexplained sudden death in family (SIDS, drownings and auto accidents)
