NROTC PRE-MEDICAL OPTION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Medical Corps (MC) Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps (NROTC) Navy Pre-Medical Option scholarship program is available to students interested in pursuing a bachelor's degree to prepare for the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) and admission to medical school through a Navy student pipeline, such as the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU) or the Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (AFHPSP).

BASIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS*:

NROTC Navy Pre-Medical Option scholarship program applicants must meet NROTC scholarship application eligibility standards below:

SAT: 540 Math, 550 Verbal Evidence-Based Reading and Writing and 1100 Combined (Math plus Evidence-Based Reading and Writing).

ACT: 21 Math, 22 English and 44 Combined (Math plus English).

- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- Must commission prior to the end of the calendar year you turn 27.
- Meet physical fitness standards.

WITH THE ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY STANDARD OF HAVING*:

- Attained a minimum high school GPA of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, or achieved a minimum SAT score of 1300 or a composite ACT score of 28.

SELECTION LEADS TO:

- 100% employment upon graduation
- Opportunity to lead and manage personnel
- Unlimited travel opportunities
- 30 days of paid vacation earned annually
- Excellent medical and dental benefits
- \$500,000* life insurance
- 401(k)-like Thrift Savings Plan

The NROTC Pre-Medical Option scholarship is designed to support undergraduate students who aspire to pursue a career in Navy medicine while simultaneously attending the college of their choice. This unique program not only provides financial assistance for college education but also integrates leadership training and military preparedness. By participating in the NROTC Pre-Medical Option, students gain valuable experience and skills that will serve them well in both their medical careers and their service to the nation. The scholarship is a commitment to excellence, leadership and dedication to the medical profession, ultimately aiming to cultivate the next generation of Navy physicians.

BENEFITS*:

- Covers tuition and fees at designated colleges or universities (up to a limit). Talk to a recruiter about tuition limits per school.
- Provides a monthly stipend for living expenses. Please talk to a recruiter for the most up-to-date stipend amounts.
- Includes allowances for books and supplies.

COMMITMENT:

- Recipients must serve in the Navy after the completion of medical school and residency, for a minimum of four years.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- Apply through the NROTC program at participating colleges or universities.
- Competitive selection based on academic performance, leadership potential and physical fitness.

WHEN AM I OBLIGATED TO THE NAVY IF I ACCEPT THE SCHOLARSHIP?

If a Midshipman leaves the program after their sophomore year, they may either be required to serve two years on active enlisted duty or repay all tuition paid to date. The exact amount would depend on the amount of tuition and fees covered up to the point of disenrollment.
